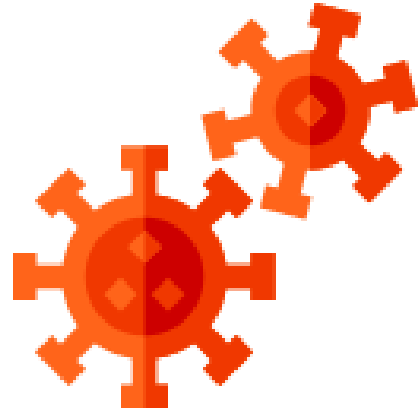
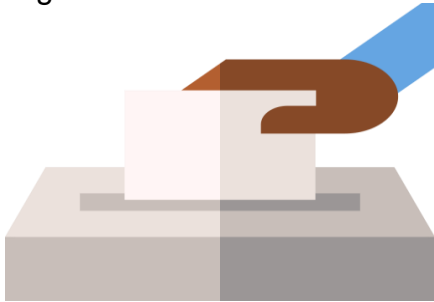


# VOTING DURING COVID-19

## Safe Voting During COVID-19

- Use early voting, if available.
- Maintain social distancing.
- Wear a cloth face covering.
- Bring your own black ink pen and stylus or similar object for use with touchscreen voting machines.
- Come prepared with [all relevant documents](#) and complete any registration forms prior to arriving at the polling location.



## Early Voting

- Early voting timing may vary [by state](#), most states spread early voting out over a 14-day period
- Helps alleviate lines and creates less crowded polling centers

## Vote by Mail

- Each state has an option to [vote by mail](#), but you may have to meet certain criteria
- Some states may offer an option to vote by mail for all citizens given the COVID-19 pandemic, but this remains to be determined and will vary by state
- Colorado, Hawaii, Oregon, Utah, and Washington offer all-mail voting



## Absentee Voting

- Forty out of fifty states, plus the District of Columbia, have no-excuse mail-in voting
- States that require an excuse for absentee voting: Alabama, Arkansas, Connecticut\*, Delaware, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Mississippi, Missouri, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, West Virginia
- States may amend their rules for 2020 elections, so check your states guidelines as we approach the election!

\*Connecticut passed a [no-excuse mail-in voting bill](#) for the November 2020 election.
