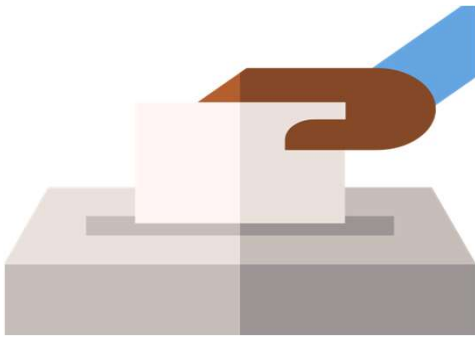


VOTING DURING COVID-19

Safe Voting During COVID-19

- Use early voting or vote by mail, if possible.
- Maintain social distancing.
- Wear a mask or face covering.
- Bring your own black ink pen and stylus or similar object for use with touchscreen voting machines.
- Come prepared with [all necessary documents](#) and complete any registration forms prior to arriving at the polling location.



Vote by Mail

- [Vote by mail](#) allows you to vote from home instead of going to a polling place.
- Voters must send their completed ballots back to the stated address by the deadline.
- Voters might also be able to turn in their completed ballots to a local drop-off box.

Early Voting

- Early voting allows citizens to cast ballots at a polling place prior to the official election date.
- Early voting timing varies [by state](#); most states spread early voting out over a 14-day period.
- Helps alleviate lines and creates less crowded polling centers.



Vote by Mail, cont'd

- Each state has an option to vote by mail but the laws vary greatly and change frequently.
- For the most up-to-date information on absentee/mail-in voting, visit [CanIVote](#) and select your state from the drop-down menu.
- Colorado, Hawaii, Oregon, Utah, and Washington offer all-mail voting.
- Be sure to read and follow instructions carefully, including signing your name and dating the ballot.
